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Steering wheel cover sewalong donated by: SewKnitMomma

Materials 1/4-1/2yd of woven fabric about 2 yards of matching FOE.

~ Measure the outer circumference of your car's steering wheel. Mine is 44", which worked out perfectly, b/c that is the width of the fabric.

~Cut 2 strips of your fabric 4" wide, and the length of your measurement in that previous step.



If your measurement is longer than the width of your fabric, you'll need to cut multiple 4" wide strips and piece them together to make the right length.

 \sim Fold the fabric lengthwise, with right sides together (RST), and sew the short ends with a 1/4" seam allowance.



~Turn one of the rings of fabric right side out. Matching the seams, put the rings together

with their wrong sides facing each other. Pin in place if needed.



~Starting at the seam on one side, sew the FOE around the edge of the ring, stretching the

FOE as far as it will go.





~Finish one side, then do the same thing on the other side. Add a decorative tag if you want to.

If you are worried about slipping, You could use grippy shelf lining, or rug grip as your second strip of fabric, and just sew it together as you would in these instructions. I haven't tried this yet, so it's just a thought. I didn't have any problems with mine slipping while I was driving, but I could see it happening, so the non-slip stuff would probably be a good idea.
